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| <p>Create a newspaper from either Ireland or from Canada for one day in 1847. The newspaper must include at least five sections.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Front Page Story (200 words approximately)</li> <li>2) Editorial which covers the same content as the front page story from a different perspective. (150 words)</li> <li>3) World News (150 words)</li> <li>4) Birth Announcements</li> <li>5) Obituaries</li> </ol>   | <p>Create a timeline of Irish History. Some possible choices include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Irish Mythological (or Legendary) History</li> <li>2) Irish Religious History</li> <li>3) Ireland through War</li> <li>4) Other timelines at the discretion of the teacher.</li> </ol>  | <p>Create an original music video or an animation for one of the songs mentioned in the Irish History through Song presentation. Include a written report of 250 words (minimum) detailing the important events as well as your reasons for choosing the event or time period. (be sure to include the sources of any images used)</p>   |
| <p>Create a script for a "Talk Show". Interview at least two people. You can choose "ordinary" people, political figures, etc. Present at least two viewpoints of a historical event(s). For example, the Easter Rising, the transplantation, Viking Raids, etc. Your interview and responses for each case must be historically accurate. You may prerecord your "Talk Show" or present it live. Be sure to include the sources for any information *(250 words).</p>   | <p>Choose one of the songs from the list on the back of this sheet. Research the origin of the song (what timeframe it applies to and what historical events are the base of the song. If possible find the author and the county of origin.) Create a poster for the song. The poster must include the lyrics, historical reference information and must be illustrated to depict an aspect of the song. Visual appeal will be important. (* Each song may only be chosen once. When you have decided on your song let me know and I will take it off the list.)</p> | <p>Create a scrapbook for an important historical event during Irish or Irish-Canadian history. The scrapbook must be at least 5 pages and should include important historical events along with day-to-day information such as fashion, entertainment, shopping and so forth. Be creative but maintain historical accuracy. Be sure to include the sources of any information or images. Include a brief (150 word) explanation of the timeframe you chose and why you chose it.</p>                                    |
| <p>Create an original song or write original lyrics for an Irish song that already exists. Either must based on an historical event of your choice. The song must be 3 minutes or more.</p> <p>The song may be prerecorded or performed live. (You may ask someone to accompany you on an instrument or you may play an instrument while another person sings.)</p> <p>The lyrics of the song must be historically accurate. Include a brief report explaining why you chose the event and any significant historical facts about the event. (150 words minimum)</p> | <p>Create a series of 5 or more political cartoons which focus on an important historical time period in Ireland (or in Canada as it relates to Ireland). You may represent differing points of view in the cartoons (for example British vs. Irish) Cartoons must be historically accurate and must include a paragraph on the back or attached to it explaining the historical context of the "humour".</p>   | <p>Build a model of any of the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) A "passage tomb"</li> <li>2) A "hill fort"</li> <li>3) A "crannog" (a home built on a manmade island, with a wall)</li> <li>4) A Viking long boat</li> <li>5) A "coffin ship"</li> </ol> <p>Include a report, which explains your reasons for choosing the model and its historical importance. Plan to display your model and to include either a brief slide show or a display board explaining the features of the model.</p> |
