



A reminder for students to bring the proper clothes for PE classes. This is done through a 12-minute walk or jog (depending on each student's THR) and 8 minutes of stretching and core strength exercises. We are currently up to 8 minutes on our jog/walk. We expect to be at the full 12 minutes by mid-October.

IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Public Health Nurses will be having Immunization Clinics at school for the following grades as indicated in the table below.

GRADE 7 Girls: A pamphlet explaining the vaccine offered and a letter to parents was sent home in September. **The next vaccine will be given on December 6, 2011.**

GRADE 9 Students: The pamphlet explaining the vaccine offered and the parents' letter will be sent later for their clinics to held in October-November, 2011. **Consent forms will need to be returned to the homeroom teacher.**

This is the opportunity for your child to receive their vaccines as recommended by the province of New Brunswick. Thank you for contributing to the success of our Immunization programs. Your collaboration is greatly appreciated.

*Tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertusis vaccine will be offered only to students who did not receive it in Grade 6. Measles, Mumps & Rubella (MMR) will be offered only if the second dose not previously received.
